SERMON

In the Last Days

8 THE ATHANASIAN CREED

PART 2

Whosoever will be saved, before all things it is necessary that he hold the catholic faith. And the catholic faith is this:

That we worship one God in Trinity, and Trinity in unity, neither confounding the persons, nor dividing the substance.

The Father was neither made nor created nor begotten; the Son was neither made nor created, but was alone begotten of the Father; the Spirit was neither made nor created, but he proceeds from the Father and the Son.

Thus there is one Father, not three fathers; one Son, not three sons; one Holy Spirit, not three spirits.

And in this Trinity, no one is before or after, greater or less than the other; but all three persons are in themselves, coeternal and coequal; and so we must worship the Trinity in unity and the unity in Trinity. Whoever desires to be saved should think thus about the Trinity.

Northwestern Brazil

Over the last four years of our seventeen years' service as a pilot / mechanic family in Brazil we helped establish a helicopter station in western Brazil. Helicopters have a huge impact on the ministries in this region. After settling into our new home to begin work with JAARS in North Carolina we made final preparations to return to western Brazil in January to complete Bruno's training as the new helicopter pilot. Last year, the mission helicopter was destroyed by a windstorm and another had to be ordered. Recently, amid cheering, waving, and tears, we watched Jeremiah and Bruno land the new mission helicopter at the new hangar in Cruzeiro do Sul, Brazil. Soon, the first ministry flights to missionaries in remote locations will commence.

In early spring we plan to return to our new home in the States and apply ourselves to our new roles, training and recruiting future pilots with JAARS. There are so many things we are thankful for. Thank you for bringing our ministry and needs before the Lord in prayer. We pray we stay securely fastened to Christ. We pray the same for our friends at Westminster Church.
